This trunk show is a collection of quilts which represents traditional Dresden's from years ago, up to and including her "Thoroughly Modern Dresden" designs. I encourage you to join us for this thoroughly entertaining program on Monday, May 8.

On Sunday, May 7, Anelie will be leading a workshop entitled, JELLY ROLL DRESDEN – SPLIT BLADE, where she will teach us how to make the striking designs shown here by using precut 2 1/2" strips. We will learn a modern way to piece this Dresden block using her stitch-n-flip technique which requires NO appliqué. Students can choose from a variety of different designs. One pattern per student is included in the cost of the class.

I hope his letter touched you, as it did me. We wrote back and forth several times as I kept him updated. In one of his las correspondences, he wrote:


“Our friends father who was a pilot in WW2 and turned 90 received his QOV yesterday.. That was so great.”
