Peggy has been presenting programs and workshops at guilds and seminars since 1988. She has exhibited quilts in the San Diego Quit Show, Road to California, the IQA show in Houston, AQS in Paducah, and Tactile Architecture IV. She lives in San Diego, California and is married with two grown sons."



TIPS AND TRICKS

If you're sitting at the sewing machine quilting for long periods of time, your muscles can tense up and you can get aches and pains in your neck, shoulders, hands, and back. Some of you might know that I'm a yoga instructor. So I have created a little yoga routine I do about every 15 to 30 minutes while I'm sewing. It takes less than 2 minutes and relieves tension in the muscles. You might also find that it helps to calm you, if you're working on something that has you a bit frustrated, and bring oxygen back to the brain to make you feel refreshed.

So here we go:

- I.Stand with your feet together, hands by your side, and relax your shoulders down, lengthening up through the spine. Close your eyes for a moment and take three deep breaths, relaxing your muscles on each exhale.
- 2. Inhale, and take your arms out to the side and overhead, touching the palms together, exhale and bring the arms down to your sides. Repeat three times.
- 3. Inhale to bring your arms overhead again, lace your fingers and turn the palms up, pushing toward the ceiling and lifting the chest, stay for three deep breaths.
- 4. Exhale, release the hands, thumbs pointing down, and bring the arms down behind your back. Inhale, lace the fingers and reach back, lifting the chest forward and pulling the shoulder blades together, stay for three deep breaths. Release.

- 5. Tuck your chin into your chest, bend the knees slightly, and exhale as you roll down toward the floor, one vertebrae at a time. Let your arms and head hang down, hinging forward from the hips, straightening your legs if you can by lifting the tailbone to the ceiling. Stay for three deep breaths, then tighten your abdominal muscles, bend the knees, & roll yourself up from the base of the spine, one vertebrae at a time.
- 6. Roll your shoulders back three times in large circles, then roll them forward three times. Inhale to shrug your shoulders, exhale to release them down, repeat three times.
- 6. Roll your head from side to side, looking over each shoulder, repeat three times.
- 7. Reach your left arm out in front of you, making a stop signal. Using your other hand, gently stretch you fingers back toward you. Repeat on the right
- 8. Take one more deep breath, inhaling energy. Release all the air out of your lungs, exhaling every bit of tension from your body.

Now get back to quilting! Namaste.
