Therefore, a new Small Groups chairmanship is being created to help coordinate this. Karen McCarty will be the chair.



Member Highlight! Irene Ashkenas visits Bali and shares her trip

As many of you know, in October I joined 20 other quilters and Rosie and Vic Gonzalez (of Rosie's Calico Cupboard) on a guided tour of Bali, Bali is a rainforest island in Indonesia. Our transit time from Los Angeles to Denpasar, Bali, via Hong Kong was approximately 25 hours. Denpasar is the capital city of Bali and is very crowded with motor scooters being the main form of transportation. Entire families ride on one scooter and compete with cars, trucks, and buses. The countryside is mainly rice paddies along with sweet potatoes, corn, soybeans, and other vegetable patches.

Other than Denpasar, there are no cities, just clustered villages. Without the distinction of cities and suburbs, it was hard to determine where families lived. The Balinese, who are predominantly Hindu (the rest of Indonesia is mainly Muslim), live in family compounds. Each compound has a family shrine to honor the deceased family members. Each village also has a temple and the Balinese live their lives around their spirituality and make offerings at least 3 times daily, at home and at every business. These offerings are placed at the entrance to businesses, entrances to homes, and at each shrine.

Of course, we all had batiks on our minds and got to satisfy that by visiting three batik factories, each one using a different technique. The first one used what we would call a whole cloth quilt top. On this fabric, a design (usually floral) is drawn and then the design is outlined with wax. The artist paints the design and when the paint is dry, the piece is boiled to remove the wax, leaving a white outline around the painted design.

The next day we went to Princess Mirah's factory. Princess Mirah is a beautiful and gracious lady who is the granddaughter of the last King of Bali. Her factory produces more traditional, stamped batiks. The white fabric is dyed, and then a pattern is stamped on using a stamp dipped in wax.

The fabric is then redyed and sometimes it is "scrunched up" and another color is drizzled on. Once it is dry, the fabric is boiled to remove the wax.

The third method is to draw a pattern on white fabric. Wax is applied on the drawn lines and then the piece is dyed. After the piece is dry, it is boiled to remain the wax leaving a white drawing on colored fabric. This factory employed very talented, very patient people who each took one member of our group and helped us to make our own batik panel. Mine is dark blue with koi on it. As soon as I make it into a wall hanging, I will bring it in to share!



The remainder of the trip involved a trip to the Bali Bird Park, a ride on an elephant, a trip to the monkey forest, and shopping....lots and lots of shopping! The market area of Denpasar has a two-block area of stalls selling fabric. Batik is about \$2.25 a meter insuring we each brought an extra suitcase to be filled with batiks!

On the last day there, as we were checking out of the resort, we were treated to a 6.8 earthquake. While everyone else was running in panic, us Southern Californians sat calmly in the lobby until Security made sure we were all out on the driveway!

If you get the chance to visit Bali, take it!




