

The first was an absolute gold mine of tips while exploring various coloring pencils, pens, markers and other media to transform our black and white fabrics into new, custom fabrics to use in our quilts and other creative endeavors. She also gave us a brief introduction to the art and benefits of Zen doodling. So much FUN!!!
