Programs - Up Next 2013/2014

February 10' 2014's speaker is our own Susan Axelrod. Susan will have a Trunk Show of beautiful quilts she has made. Susan is having our workshop on February 9, 2014 the DAY BEFORE the meeting. Please go to Friendship's website (http://friendshipquilterssd.org/) to see the beautiful Hummingbird and Flower applique wall quilt we will be making. This is a "Susan Original" and it is absolutely gorgeous. The Supply List can be found under Workshops. We need five more attendees to be on track with our budget.

March 10, 2014's speaker is Anelie Belden. Anelie's website is www.Anelie.com and she is going to be teaching us how to do Trapunto-by-Machine on March 9, 2014 THE DAY BEFORE THE MEETING. There is still room in the workshop and we would love your participation. Please be sure to visit Friendship's website (http://friendshipquilterssd.org/) to obtain the Supply List – you have the option of purchasing a kit for \$15.00 or Anelie has provided paper templates of circles or hearts so those who do not want to buy a kit can premark their tops. This will make more class time to focus on learning Trapunto. Students have a choice of 3 different designs. Be sure to stop by the Programs Table to sign up and obtain your paper template so you can get your piece ready. You won't want to miss this workshop. It is going to be awesome. We will have the templates with us at the February meeting – that is the last opportunity you will have to get one. We really need participation in this workshop. Anelie (rumor has it) is the best trapunto teacher around so you really should plan on attending.

April 15, 2014's speaker is Beth Ferrier. Beth's website is http://www.applewd.com/. Beth will be teaching us a lovely little taste of appliqué. We will be making a wall hanging called "Simply Roses" and this wall hanging (finishing 8 ½ x 20 ½) makes a fine introduction to Beth's Hand Appliqué by Machine technique. We'll explore color and value, making our templates, glue basting and sewing our motifs, making perfect circles and tiny stems. Be sure to stop by the Program Table to sign up for this workshop. If you didn't get a chance to take Kim Diehl's workshop you certainly won't want to miss this one. There is plenty of space available – so we need you to sign up now. Our last Program of the year will be Cathy Van Gruggen and she will conduct a workshop on May 13, 2014 entitled Garden Walk. 

Have you visited the Opportunity Table to obtain your tickets yet?

Everything is ready so get your tickets soon. The name of the quilt is "Oldie but a Goodie". Cookie has so graciously volunteered to be our "record keeper". Cookie has done this a few times in the past and is experienced in keeping the "books". Now we need YOU!!! Please stop by the Opportunity Quilt table and pick up your tickets. We only ask that you take and sell \$20 in tickets – you can do that – sure you can!!! Just think if we all – 170 members of us – take and sell \$20 in tickets we will have ticket sales in the amount of \$3400. That is just money earned by you taking \$20 in tickets and doesn't include the money we can earn taking the quilt to various guilds, art shows, quilt shows, all over. 
