We will also have two speakers present from the facilities we support. February 10' 2014's speaker is our own Susan Axelrod. Susan will have a Trunk Show of all the beautiful quilts she has made. Susan is having our workshop on February 9, 2014 the DAY BEFORE the meeting. ## **Recipe Corner - Francine Nadey**

#### Easy

#### Enchilada Casserole

For average size slow cooker:

Ingredients:

Chili powder to taste, (I just shake some on the meat as it is cooking.)

One large 28 oz. can of "La Victoria" mild enchilada sauce

One medium 15 oz. can of tomato sauce (I used Hunt's "no salt")

2 large or 3 medium onions, chopped, usually use yellow onions, but any will do.

One pound cheddar cheese sharp and one pound of Monterey Jack cheese.

When I don't have time to shred I buy the bag of "Mexican Style" shredded mixed cheeses at Costco (you get 2 bags, only need one). I prefer the taste of the non-shredded cheeses but when in a hurry the pre-shredded will work.

Two dozen corn tortillas, I usually buy the 3 dozen pack because I like them for other things.

1 to 1 ½ pounds lean ground beef.

Secret to the great taste - 4 cans of chopped black olives, drained.


Cook the ground beef and crumble it best you can as it cooks, you can season the beef if you want, and I just shake some chili powder onto the cooking meat and taste it after fully cooked. Add more if you like. I also like to add about a cup of fresh chopped onion to the beef as it cooks and sometimes sprinkle a little garlic powder on the beef as it cooks.

Pour the enchilada sauce and tomato sauce into a large bowl. I rinse the cans with filtered water and place the water in the bowl with the sauces, up to a cup of water is OK. I take about 24 tortillas and place them into the bowl of sauce. Place each ingredient in separate bowls next to each other to make it handy to layer the ingredients. Spoon sauce into the bottom of the slow cooker to cover the bottom. Line the bottom of the cooker with corn tortillas. I usually use two whole tortillas and 2-3 tortillas torn in half. Then you will layer the ingredients, the order doesn't matter; I like to end with the cheese and some sauce on top. Place chopped onions onto tortillas in the cooker, then a layer of ground beef, the chopped black olives then the cheeses. I use a large serving spoon to place some enchilada sauce from the sauce bowl on each completed layer. Then I repeat the process, layer of corn tortillas, chopped onion, ground beef, chopped black olives, cheeses, and some sauce. Usually I have four layers maybe five. Depends on the size and depth of your slow cooker, I fill to about 3/4. Make sure you use about the same amount on each layer so you don't run out of an ingredient for the last layer.

For the December meeting I assembled the enchiladas in a slow cooker and put it on low around noon with the timer set for 5 hours, because I had to leave the house. Arrived home about 5PM and the enchiladas smelled wonderful and were very hot. I left it on low until 5:45PM. When I arrived at the potluck I plugged it in and turned it on warm until we ate. You don't need to cook it that long though; if I were home I would have started it on high then turned it to low or warm after 1 1/2 hours until dinner time. I have even placed the slow cooker in my oven at 350 degrees F for only a half hour, then served it. In the rare event of leftovers. I reheat in a casserole dish in the toaster oven or place some water in a pan then the left-overs and heat until hot.

## Philanthropy

The big news for January is our special **Philanthropy Night**. Instead of the usual speaker, we will have hands-on experiences in creating some of the items we donate to different causes. Our speakers that evening will be Charlotte Fan from **Meals on Wheels** and Ursula Sorenson from **Project Linus**. We will most likely work for about an hour on these projects, which will help a lot in making kits for you to use as the year goes on. Please bring cutting mats, rotary cutters, and rulers. If you know you want to iron tape to the batting, you may want to bring an iron or ironing board, although several Board members will be bringing theirs.

We are very excited about our January program and hope to see all of you then. Your work will definitely help Ruth and me in putting kits together and organizing our materials. Hope to see you in the new year.


