

The October Meeting was GREAT! We checked out a record number of 78 library books! And we made \$58.00 at our book sale!! Thank you all for your participation. There will be no Library Table at the December meeting - so all books checked out in November will be good until January......plan to take plenty of good books home with you from our next meeting.

Retreats

Once again the retreat in Sept. was lots of fun and we all got a lot done. Now for the news. I won't say it's completely bad news because in some ways it's good.

Many of us like to arrive at the center early on Friday morning in order to get a full day of sewing in. The use of all of the electricity during that day greatly increases the utility bill. They feel we should be paying something to offset these expenses. Starting with the May 2011 retreat we will be asked to pay for meals on Friday. If you are one of the early birds and arrive before lunch, you will need to pay \$20.00 (\$10.00 for lunch and \$10.00 for dinner). If you don't plan on arriving until the afternoon, you will only need to pay \$10.00 for dinner. The good news is we won't have to think about what to bring for lunch or dinner on Friday.

These increases will be in addition to the normal

yearly \$5.00 increase so the total amounts will be \$230.00 for a shared room and \$300.00 for a private room. I think this is still a good deal. The other retreat centers I've heard of cost quite a bit more and are not nearly as nice. I hope this increase does not deter anyone from attending. Also to try and keep it simple, I would like to raise the deposit amount to \$30.00 and that way the final payment would be an even \$200.00. I will start taking sign-ups for the May retreat in February.

I almost forgot...the yearly September retreat will now be held the first weekend of November. I hope this will allow for more people to attend.


