



Color Extravagance: Experimenting with Color Border Exchange

Color Extravagance; Experimenting with Color--Border Exchange Handout

We are going to have fun with COLOR this year in Friendship Guild. Here is how it works:

- 1. Prepare a center block with your choice of colors. Be specific--this will "guide" all the borders that are added to your quilt! The size and shape you choose will determine the size and shape of your quilt when six borders have been added!
- 2. Bring this block to the October 10th Friendship Guild meeting, in a sturdy bag, with any/all preferences you have for further borders/fabrics in your quilt, written on a sturdy piece of paper.

 ****At this point we recommend you listing any and all things you do want or do not like, so your finished quilt is a work of art that you can love.
- 3. At October meeting we will exchange blocks.
- 4. Your job will then be to add TWO or FOUR borders onto the quilt you receive and return in one month.
- 5. We are keeping it simple--THIS WILL NOT BE A DESIGN NIGHTMARE--all you have to do is experiment with the colors the owner has specified. The only RULE will be the <u>required width</u> of the border, which we will draw out of a hat each month at the meeting.****Each month we will also offer an OPTIONAL technique you may/<u>may not</u> choose to use; these are meant to be helpful starting points in case you are 'stuck'.
- 6. WE will exchange our quilts for an added border six times (skipping December) and VOILA! will see our finished quilts in April, just in time to bring in May for an exhibit.
