# Jane Prario—A Trunk Show of Wearable Art

Jane has been sewing since her early teen years. She started quilting in 1988 and was encouraged to make wearable art in 1990. Her first wearable art award was at the Bazaar Del Mundo Fabric Festival in 1992 and then onto five more wins at the Bazaar Del Mundo shows. Her total wearable art awards number over twenty on the local, state and national level. Examples of her work have been in the "Journal of the International Quilt Association" and in the Winter 2002 issue of Belle Armoire (Art to Wear Magazine). The upcoming issues of "Belle Armoire" will have some more examples of her work. She was also selected to be a designer in the 2001-2002 Bernina Wearable Art Fashion Show that had its debut in Houston.

Jane will be offering instructions on two vest patterns in the November 12th workshop. Participants will need to choose between the Patchwork vest or the Laurel Burch vest. 


