Dear Friends,

A few weekends ago I visited a quilt shop that I hadn't been to in several months and noticed that the shelves looked pretty empty. One of the women with me said that she had heard that the shop wasn't doing well because of competition from Wal-Mart and another new quilt shop. A different quilter thought that the empty shelves

were the result of the shop expanding and adding many new shelves for holding fabric as well as the fabric that had been removed for the shop's booth at a local quilt show. It was an interesting observation for me to see two people presented with the same visual "evidence" and come to two striking different conclusions.

This got me to thinking about quilt shops and quilting fabric. I work with many women and quite a few want to learn to quilt. I always encourage these women to take a beginning quilting class at any local quilt shop and always try to explain the difference in fabric found at a quilt shop versus the fabric at a discount fabric chain. I encourage everyone to support their local quilt shop to keep them in business. I think about what my life would be like if I didn't have Amidon's so close to me. I love seeing the latest quilting books, feeling the newest fabrics, checking out some new notion that will make my quilting easier, and looking at the quilts (continued on page 2)

The quarterly meeting of the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds was held Saturday October 18 in Camarillo. The budget for next year was discussed and passed.


Philanthropic donations of \$1000 to the MegaJeans Project, and \$500 to help with the care of the portion of the Esprit collection returning to Lancaster PA were approved. The MegaJeans Project is also looking for groups to accept bags of new damaged jeans provided by Indigo Sportswear, Inc. They can be repaired and donated locally. A report was given and many samples of the quilts made by

member guilds for The Painted Turtle Camp were shown. They will need approximately 1200 child size throw quilts and 1200 turtle pillows each year to be given to the children so the need is huge and continuing. Their website is thepaintedturtle.org.

The program was a mock judging by two certified (NQA and AQS) judges. They emphasized that having a quilt judged was a great way to improve your next quilt. The next meeting will be held at Road to California in January where the program will be on joint efforts with other guilds, such as sharing speakers and combined shows. Guild event flyers will be available at the back table at our next meeting.




