Join us in welcoming Joan Shay for our November 14 meeting. Joan is an award winning quilter from Cape Cod, Mass.

She has developed an exciting, new and easy appliqué technique which she calls "Appli-bond".

Appli-bond is the fusing of 2 or more layers of fabric together with a bonding material. The pieces are attached to the background fabric with various embroidery stitches and the edges remain free creating a sophisticated, realistic 3-D appearance. With this technique you are able to construct flowers that would be very difficult to achieve with traditional appliqué such as the geranium, hydrangea, lilac and African violet.

She has written three books on her new technique, **Petal by Petal, Petal Play the Traditional Way**, and **3 Quilters Celebrate the 4 Seasons** (with Bethany Reynolds and Karen Combs.)

Joan's technique appeals to beginners and to experts. Beginners have instant success and experts are able to design with this technique. Her classes and lecture are informative, entertaining and humorous.





Workshop Info

There are still openings in the **Sunday November 13** workshop. We will be creating the perfect holiday block. The poinsettia and holly are easily accomplished, and the points are perfect every time. This block is comprised of <u>Appli-bond</u>© only (no traditional appliqué) therefore it is very quick and can be finished by most students in class. Sewing machines are not needed. An iron and ironing surface would be very helpful. A \$25 kit can be purchased which includes everything needed for the class. Otherwise, there is a \$5 fee for the pattern. 



Getting to know our Members


Question: What is your favorite part of quiltmaking and why?




