

The neighbors ran to the windows to see what was the matter.


From one house to the other, I leaped like a deer.



Telephone Tree



Tips & Tricks

Here's a tip from Betty Alofs, who is well known to Friendship Quilt Guild members.

'When you are sewing machine stitching, don't stare at the needle. Instead, carefully watch your guide mark, whether it is a marked line, a presser foot guide, or your walking foot guide. The needle isn't going anywhere but up and down! Guiding the fabric correctly is the key to a good seam'.
