
Program

The holidays are over and we are starting a new year. Come and meet Beth Ann Williams! Beth Ann



is an award-winning fiber artist, designer, author and teacher. Having lived in different countries and on different continents, she has enjoyed a lifetime exposure to the richness of varied cultural and artistic traditions, and a particular fascination for textiles. As a

fourth-generation quilt maker, Beth Ann had a profound respect for traditional approaches to quilt making. However, she is probably best known for her contemporary quilts and innovative methods. Her specialties include heirloom machine appliqué, decorative machine quilting, impressionist-style piecing, creative strip-piecing, ethnic design, abstract design, and applied color theory.



Our workshop, Celtic "True Lover's Knot", with Beth Ann will be on Tuesday January 10th at Amidon Quiltworks from 10:00 to 4:00. We will be creating a wallhanging based on Beth Ann's book, Celtic Quilts: A New Look for Ancient Designs. This book is

required for class. The one continuous line that forms this design is symbolic of the eternal nature of true love – love without end. The sample project was finished as a small wall-hanging, but it would work equally well as a decorative pillow or as a repeat block in a bed quilt. This is an especially good introductory patter for those who have not yet tried Celtic appliqué by machine.






Fons & Porter **Love of Quilting** magazine subscription program is <u>ongoing</u> and here's how it works:

Tips & Tricks

Here's a great tip from Susan Axelrod that will save you time and frustration.

Susan says, "Let's face it, we all need to "unsew" now and then. A sharp seam ripper makes the job easier. On one side of the seam you need to rip out, cut every third stitch. Then pull the thread on the other side of the seam allowance. This will pull out the entire seam out very easily. Also, when it's time for a new seam ripper, think about purchasing one with a flat handle. The flat handle keeps it from rolling off the sewing table onto the floor".
