## Programs

Phil is a retired school teacher from Indiana who has been quilting since 2000. As a school teacher he taught drawing, silversmithing, metalsmithing, weaving and 3D fiber design. The winner of 53 national quilt show awards, Phil has appeared on *Simply Quilts* and designed a fabric line for Free Spirit.

Phil Beaver found quilts and quilt shows by chance in 2000. Some first quilting attempts followed soon after that, but he became serious and more productive as a quilter and quilt teacher in 2003. As of January, 2006, he has produced ten large quilts and won 59 major awards, including 9 Best of Show awards, in the most major quilt shows in the world.

Come to the meeting for an entertaining and enjoyable evening. There is a 2 day workshop with fabric painting on Tuesday May 9 and appliqué on Wednesday May 10. This workshop is being held at Bits and Pieces in Escondido and is currently filled.

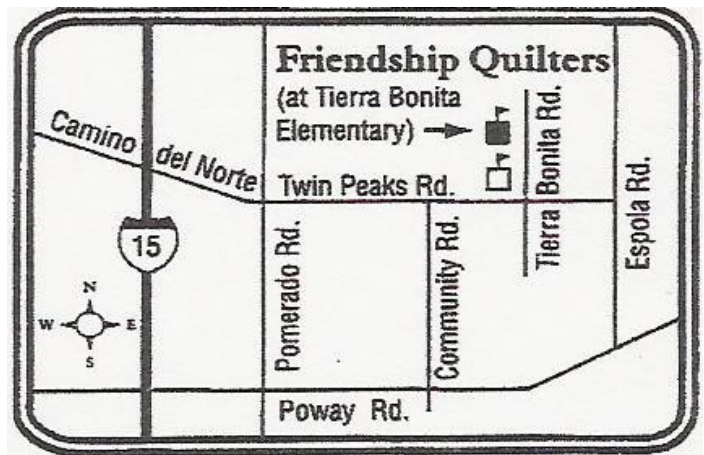

## Tips & Tricks

This tip comes from Betty Alofs, for those of you who love paper or foundation piecing, but hate the times when your block doesn't come out to the right size. Perhaps it is a little short here and there sometimes, because of the many seams and fabric folded over other fabric.

Here's Betty's solution: Mark the outside edge of the block with a highlighter before you cut sections apart to sew. This way, you will know where the edges are. Then, after piecing a whole section, take it to the cutting board and trim 1/4" around the edges of the section, EXCEPT for the outer edges, which you will make 1/2". After the entire pattern is done and the papers are removed, iron with spray starch, then trim to the proper block size. You will have that extra 1/4", allowing you to make the block the size you want.

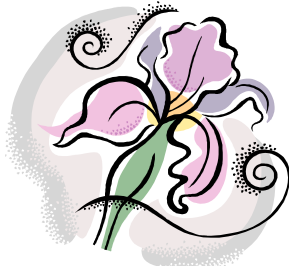

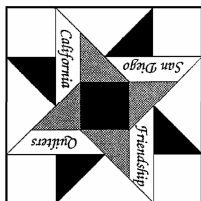
