

We thought it would be interesting to spotlight a member of Friendship Quilters each month. This month we know you'll enjoy learning more about member **Karla Seyb-Stockton**.

When Karla graduated from high school she got a beautiful "Trip Around The World" with I" squares that her grandmother had made many years before she was born. (She had died when Karla was 7 years old.). "I decided I wanted to learn how to do that."

"When I was a sophomore in college I called around to the local churches to find a quilting group and the Methodist Church had a group that met all day Tuesdays. I worked my schedule so I had a break from I0-2 and took a bag lunch, rode my bike to the church and had lunch and learned quilting with a bunch of gracious elderly women. They were surprised and delighted that I wanted to be with them, and they may have picked out my stitches after I left, but they were always very encouraging while I was with them!"

Karla had belonged to two different quilt guilds before, in Bucyrus, Ohio and Newark, CA but she got away from quilting when she was on sea duty and had a young daughter, and didn't take the time to seek out other quilters. "I missed it though, and when I learned there was an active guild here in Po-

way I immediately started to attend."



PHILANTHROPY

I am planning some new activities for this year and seriously hope you will consider donating some of your quilting skill/talent/effort to the causes we support: namely wounded veterans who are getting care at the VA Hospital in La Jolla, St Claire's Children's Home, The Poway Soroptimists who run the local battered women's shelter, and the Life Choice crisis pregnancy center, and the Ramona and Poway home meal delivery programs.

How can you get involved? You have three options to mix and match as you desire.

- I. Saturday October 14th from 8am-4pm we will have a Philanthropy Quilt-a-thon at the Lutheran Church of the Incarnation parish hall, 16889 Espola Road in Poway. Bring your sewing machine, iron and ironing board, rotary cutter and mat, scissors, needles for tying and/or other sewing supplies as you wish. ALSO, if you will be there over lunch, bring a dish to share! I will provide drinks, plates, etc. We have a number of quilts ready to tie, some tops in need of finishing and plenty of fabric to piece together. Come for all or part of the day. No need to sign up in advance!
- 2. "Ugly Duckling" Challenge--I have kits of 5 I/2" squares of "Ugly Duckling" fabric that is just waiting for YOU to transform it into a beautiful swan of a quilt or set of placemats. The only rule is that you use the fabric given (or most of it.) You can cut it.

You can sew it. You may even dye it if you wish... The kits will be available at the October and November meetings and will be due back at the June meeting when we will reveal the beautiful swans. There will be prizes!

3. You may make a quilt or placemats and bring them to any guild meeting. If you have a preference which facility your donation goes to, be sure to attach a note. Otherwise I will distribute then equitably and appropriately. I can use patriotic, masculine, feminine, baby and child oriented quilts and placemats. (Most of our meals program recipients are elderly folks living alone, but some are couples, so one of a kind placemats or matching pairs are ideal.)

Finally, one of our long-standing traditions is to make Christmas stockings (and we have had a few stockings made in non-Christmas fabrics each year and that is great too!) for St. Claire's Children's Home. They fill them with other donations and give the children who are in the midst of some pretty hard circumstances a good Christmas. I will be collecting them at the November and December meetings and then will deliver them to St Claire's.

The 43 quilts were selected by three jurors from 725 entries which were submitted by 318 artists from 20 countries. Also interesting to note is that approximately one third of the quilts are by artists appearing in a Quilt Visions exhibition for the first time. It is a wonderful collection of contemporary art quilts. There will be something here for everyone to wonder about, to

be inspired by, to learn from, to admire, and to enjoy. Oceanside Museum of Art is open Tue-Sat 10-4 and Sun 1-4. Admission \$5. Quilt San Diego/ Quilt Visions and Oceanside Museum of Art members get in FREE.


