PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Is there such a thing as Quilter's Block? Four FQ friends & I took a trip to M&L recently. I had all the intention of coming back with tons of new material. "Shop till you drop" was on my agenda. My husband even joked that my car trunk wasn't large enough to hold all the fabrics we'd be buying. However, that was not to be. I literally spent three hours trying really, really hard to buy something. Walked up and down the aisles repeatedly. Nothing caught my eye. What was wrong with me? The other women didn't seem to be experiencing any problem choosing fabrics, their carts where piled high. While everyone was checking out, I felt guilty going home empty handed so I bought three yards of fabric from a bolt from a friend's cart. Has this ever happened to you? It's a strange feeling walking away from a quilt store empty handed or not excited about a purchase.

They say never grocery shop on an empty stomach because you end up buying more than you really need. That same philosophy might work to avoid Quilter's Block. I do not know of any good reason not to buy fabric – but some backup might help. Have some magazines or a few patterns handy to bring with you next time you go to a quilt shop without an intended pattern in mind. They might inspire you - and it's better than wandering the aisles aimlessly!

PHILANTHROPY NEWS!

We have a number of exciting opportunities to give of ourselves and our talent right now.

1. Baby Quilts for Babies Born to Deployed Sailors

There has been a request come to us for six baby quilts to be made for babies that are due while their dads are on a six month Navy deployment. The ship is already deployed, and these babies are due between now and March. Lois Russell has offered to supply the batting and long arm quilting for the first six. Make the top and supply the back. She will quilt it and give it back to you for binding.

2. Small Quilts for the Patient Exam Rooms at Moore's Cancer Center

We have been requested to make 18x18 inch quilts of any color combination, any style to be hung in the patient exam rooms at the Moore's Cancer Center at UCSD in La Jolla. There is no specific color scheme, because the rooms are very neutral (bland!) and they are thinking small quilts would be pleasing to look at and have a calming effect. They are looking for a wide variety--masculine, feminine, for children, pieced, appliqué, whole cloth, simple, complex, geometric, traditional, art quilt, medallion--the quilts will not be seen together, as there will be one per room. They are also looking for three or four larger quilts (30x40 inches) to hang in lobby areas. The Cancer

Center is already in operation, so they would accept the donations as soon as they are made, however, they realize they cannot rush volunteers who are donating their time and talent.

IF YOU ARE INTERESTED IN PARTICIPATING IN EITHER OF THESE TWO PROJECTS, PLEASE CONTACT ME TO SIGN UP. My name and number is in the directory! Or you can sign up at the November meeting!

Our ongoing projects continue. I took 13 quilts that had been collected in September and October to the Poway Battered Women's Shelter and they were overjoyed to get them. I have placemats to deliver to the Home Delivery Meals Programs and will be delivering quilts to St Claire's and the VA Hospital after the Quilt-a-thon. We will be collecting Christmas Stockings for the children at St Claire's Home again this year, so bring them to the November and December meetings. Thanks for all you do, Quilt Philanthropists! Congratulations to Susan Axelrod, winner of the door prize given (belatedly) for the participants of the August Philanthropy Work Night!



TIPS AND TRICKS

If you plan on using a large or medium print as part of a patchwork design, make a window template the size of the pieces you'll be using so that you can preview what they will look like cut. Make sure you try the template out on different sections of the fabric, as there are often places where no print will showing. If you still want to use the fabric, you can solve the problem by fussy cutting each piece separately.

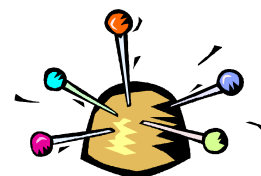

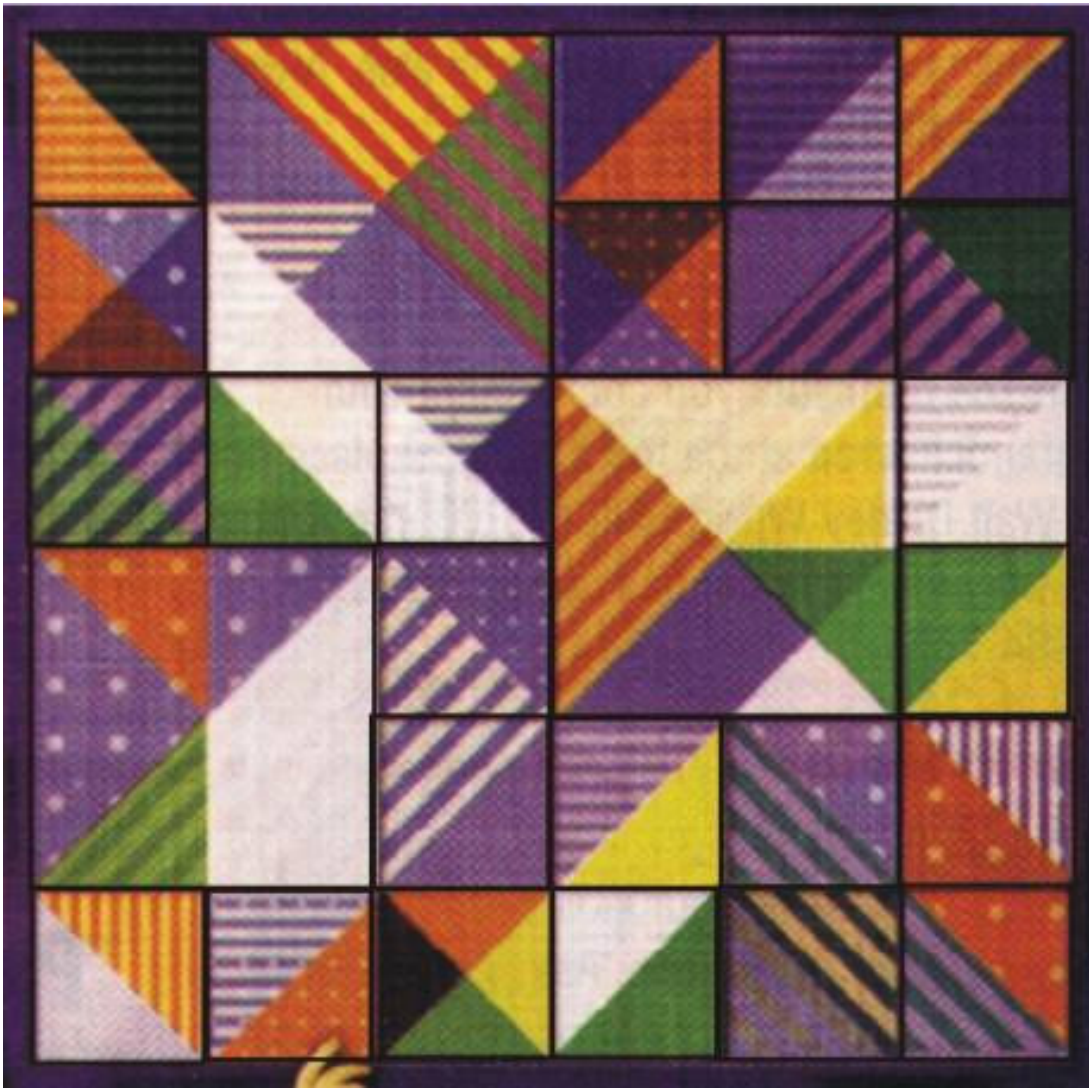

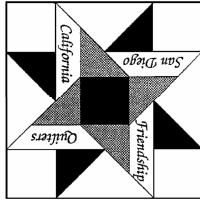

Stitched into this patchwork quilt is a puzzle--one that will test the sharpness of everyone in your family. At a glance, you can see a mosaic of colors and shapes. But now look more carefully. Using the black stitched borders, how many perfect squares of any size can you find? Remember, a square means that every side has to be of equal length. You'll find the answer below.



Answer: The quilt has 41 squares (24 with 1-unit sides; 8 with 2-unit sides; 6 with 3-unit sides; 1 with 4-unit sides; 1 with 5-unit sides; and 1 with 6-unit sides).
