Friendship Quilters Guild of San Diego is a non profit corporation organized to educate the community and to promote interest in all forms of quilting. General Guild meetings are held the second Monday of the month. They are usually held at Valley Elementary School, Poway, CA. Annual membership is \$25 from June I to May 3I of the following year. At the January meeting, membership dues are reduced to \$15 for the remainder of the fiscal year. Members who are not able to attend meetings or enjoy other benefits of regular membership may pay \$10 per year for a "Newsletter Only" membership and pay the guest fee of \$5 per meeting on the occasions when they are able to attend a meeting.





#### TIPS AND TRICKS

Not sure how your quilting will look on the quilt top you've made? Try making a sandwich of the scrap fabrics you used on your top, batting, and backing. Test if the contrast should be lighter or darker, or another color thread might work better, by test quilting on the sandwiched piece.
