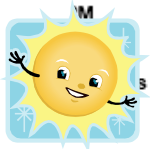


4th of July Quilt Show

Tips and Tricks

For those of you who like hand sewing, here are some tips to keep your stitches running smoothly:

1. For small stitches in hand piecing, use a thin needle, such as #12 hand appliqué or sharps. I like to use straw needles for hand appliqué because they are longer and very thin, including at the eye, which helps make sharp points.
2. When sewing inside points on appliqué, try running the point of the needle across a glue stick, then run the tip under the inside point or curve. It will hold under stray threads until you sew the edge down.
3. If you use pins to hold down appliqué pieces, try using sequin pins. They are very short and lay flat, which helps prevent thread from looping around them. Another tip is to pin the appliqué from the back of the block.

The 9th Annual Southern California Quilt Run is ready, set, sew and go over two extended weekends, Thursday through Sunday July 12-15 and July 19-22.

Thirty-four quilting shops throughout Southern California are participating and make up the route that extends as far east as Palm Springs, as far south as El Cajon, as far west as the ocean, and as far north as Lancaster. The Southern California Association of Quilt Shop Owners, a membership organization comprised of sewing shops in Southern California that identify themselves primarily as quilt shops sponsors this yearly event. Preparations and plans for the 2007 Southern California Quilters Run began in September 2007.

All 34 shops will be open from 9 AM to 9 PM Thursday through Saturday, 9 AM to 5 PM on Sunday to provide ample time for folks to make the trek.

There'll be lots of fun, lots of hysteria and lots of frenzy! Join in the caravan of quilters, and be eligible for all kinds of prizes! Get yourselves together, get the jalopy out of the garage, pack some laughs and some snacks, and get ready to have the time of your quilting life!

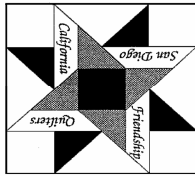

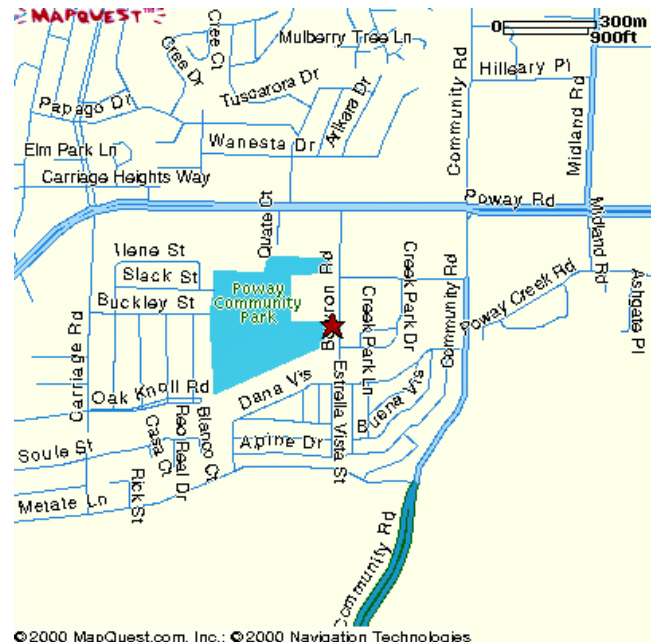
