Thank You

Hi everyone!

Just wanted to thank everyone and give you some update.

I want you to know how grateful I am for all your prayers and support during this difficult time. The beautiful batik prayer quilt created in 7 days by 28 wonderful women brought me to tears when presented and many, many times since then. I pray with it on my stomach every day and will treasure it forever. Visits to the hospital and home, your many phone calls and getwell cards have been so heartening. My husband, John & I were so overwhelmed and so appreciative of the delicious meals brought to our home everyone day for three weeks after surgery. All of these kind actions have contributed so much to my recovery. Once a person gets a terminal diagnosis their whole world is turned around. Support from family, friends and faith becomes a major factor in their physical and mental wellbeing. There just are not enough words to express my appreciation for everything you've done for me.

Now for some good news. With Kaiser, since the cancer has spread from my colon to the liver, I am not eligible for surgery to remove the cancer before starting chemo. My only option was chemo and agreeing to participate in a clinical trial using two new drugs. The sideaffects are horrific and I've cried so much and lost a great amount of sleep just thinking about it – but it was the only treatment option with Kaiser.

I truly believe because of all the prayers that a Dr. Hart from UCSD came into my life. After reviewing my records, he says I'm a perfect candidate for surgery followed up with standard chemo. He estimates approx. 40- 50% of the liver would be removed. However, up to 85% can be removed and survive. I anticipate surgery in 2-3 weeks with a 4-6 month recovery.

Since this nightmare started I am now so very hopeful and happy and looking toward the future. I hate to ask again, but please keep me in your prayers. Don't know when I'll be able to attend a meeting but please keep in touch. My home phone is: 858-748-4837 and email: johnloretta@cox.net

Tips and Tricks

What do you do with all the left over scraps from your quilt project? Throw them in a bag or drawer? Ugh! What a mess to try and sort through if you plan on using any of them.

I think it is worth the time and effort to organize them right away into squares, strips, triangles, etc., and by size. Keep them in separate Ziploc bags with the shape and size marked on the outside, and store them in a scrap box. You'll be surprised at how soon you have enough for a scrap quilt. Sometimes I also end up with strips long enough to create binding for another quilt. All the really small or odd shaped scraps are kept in a box for appliqué.




