Tips and Tricks

A very basic tip but one that beginner sewers are often not aware of: If your machine has a front or top loading bobbin, then more than likely your needle should be inserted with the flat side toward the back. ALWAYS MAKE SURE your presser foot is raised when threading your machine. This ensures that the top thread sits in the tension disks and does not loop underneath. More often than not, the loopies you see on the underside of your sewing are the top thread not the bobbin thread. If you are having tension problems, there are several things you can try. Put a different color thread in your bobbin so you can see what is really happening. If the bobbin

thread is showing on the top of your sewing, then you either need to tighten your bobbin tension or loosen your top tension. If you are not sure how to do that, check your book or contact someone who might know. If your top thread is showing underneath, and you are sure the thread is firmly seated between the tension disks, then you can try tightening the top thread tension or loosening the bobbin tension. Of course there is always the possibility that there might actually be something wrong with your sewing machine in which case you may need to have it serviced.






