Tips and Tricks

Spring is almost over, and we're heading toward summer. Things are heating up. Here are a few tips for staying cool, calm, and collected while you quilt over the summer months.

Before you sit down to quilt, if you don't have air conditioning (I don't), make sure you set your machine up in an area where you have a cool, cross breeze. I open the front door and the back sliding door and sit at the kitchen table where the air blows right through, plus there's a ceiling fan there, also.

Wear cool, comfortable clothes that allow you to move freely, maybe even wrap a sarong around you, kick your shoes off, and get your hair up off the nape of your neck.

Keep hydrated: just as you would when you work out, you should have a bottle of cold water alongside you so you can take a sip every so often. Don't drink soda, it will actually make you thirstier. Remember, too, that often when we think we're hungry, we're actually thirsty.

Here's my last tip, if you're not going to have a get away vacation this year — buy yourself one of those relaxation CD's with the sound of ocean waves in the background. If you stop and close your eyes every so often between quilt blocks, you can imagine you're quilting by the sea in a beach bungalow, the waves crashing on the shore just outside your window. Well, it's worth a try.

Quilt Auction Coming October 11, 2008

The quilt auction will be held October 11, 2008 at the Poway Community Center Auditorium on Civic Center Drive. Preview will begin at 10 AM, the auction starting at 11 AM expecting to be out of there by 2PM. Our auctioneer will be Mike Rupley from Central Sewing.

To date I have a small committee helping, but in the next couple of months I will be needing volunteers for things like actual set up and break down of the auction, cashiering, and quilt modeling during the auction.

To date we have 7 completed quilts, 1 completed wall hanging, 1 holiday pillow and 1 table runner. In addition we have 13 completed quilts pledged. I have received 17 quilt tops to be quilted – many that need backing fabric (seven have been taken by volunteers to be quilted leaving 10 plus an additional 8 quilt tops that will need finishing when those who have pledged them get them to me. Then of course there is binding and labeling that needs to be done. Right now if we can complete what is pledged we will have 48 quilts/wall hangings. I would like to see at least 60 to make this auction a real success.

Now that you know what work we have cut out for us, you can expect a phone call in the near future asking for your help with completing these quilts. If your time is not available, we are always in need of donations of fabric to back and bind some of these quilt tops. Thank you for all you do!!




