Tips and Tricks

When folding a quilt, fold in thirds along the longest edge, then in thirds again along the opposite edge. This will minimize wear and tear on the center of your quilt. To minimize wrinkling, fold with the pieced side out.

The Quilt Show will be held on Friday and Saturday, October 17 and 18 from 10:00AM to 4:00PM. It will be held at the Mountain View Community Church located at 1191 Meadowlark Way in Ramona. (Near the corner of Highway 78 and Ash.) The Show admission is FREE!

There will be approximately 100 unique quilts on display in a nicely decorated Church Sanctuary. Again there will be door prize drawings, lots of vendors of fabric, gifts, and sewing supplies. Snacks and lunch will be available courtesy of the church Youth Group at nominal cost. Tickets will be sold for a beautiful Opportunity Quilt. (It suggests Monet's Water Lilies!) The drawing for the Queen size quilt will be on October 18 at the close of the show.

Philanthropy

A new year, a new chance to outdo our successful "Giving Season of 2007-2008". Last year June 2007 to May 2008, the following items were donated to Philanthropy and delivered to: Randy Children's Hospital: 15 diagnostic dolls, 125 chemo-scarves, 12 dorags, 14 quilts; Meals on Wheels: 8 wheel chair bags, 234 placemats, 10 quilts, 2 crocheted quilts; Veterans Hospital: 52 wheel chair bags, 8 quilts; Life Choice: 2 quilts; St Claire's: 60 Christmas socks; Soroptimists: 12 quilts (which were donated to the Marines); Palomar Hospital NICU: 2 blankets; Balboa Naval Hospital: 3 quilts. Note Approximately 50 guild members worked on or donated these items. GREAT JOB - THANKS!


