

ground of sewing and crafts, Charlotte made her first quilt, a Log Cabin in the barn-raising pattern, in 1974 and then made several more traditional quilts. Since 1983, her specialty has been one-of-a-kind, original pictorial quilts made with either, or both, appliqué and piecing techniques. My pictorial appliqué technique is a unique one featuring forms that are independently layered and created. These created forms are then attached to the background. The pictorial piecing technique makes use of set-in corners, which eliminates many unnecessary seams and makes for a smoother and more flexible piecing process. She enjoys creating realistic and representational images from the unlikely mediums of fabric.

Charlotte's quilts have won many prestigious awards; among them second place in the first Great American Quilt Contest in honor of the Statue of Liberty Centennial, several first places at the American Quilter's Society Show, and two Best of Shows at the Houston International Quilt Festival and Best of Show at the 2006 Mid-Atlantic Quilt show. Wearable Art is another of her pursuits with her garments being a part of the Fairfield Fashion Shows in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1991, 1994, 1998, the Bernina Fashion Show for 2002, 2003, 2005 and 2006. One of her garments was the Crème de la Crème winner

for the 2003 Bernina Fashion Show. Two of her garments have also won awards at the AQS Style Show.

Charlotte has taught and lectured locally, nationally and internationally, having taught in Australia, Taiwan, New Zealand and Canada.

She has authored two books explaining my pictorial appliqué technique. Faces & Places - Images in Appliqué explains my unique techniques for layering to obtain a shaded and dimensional look. My second book, Focus on Features - Life-like Portrayals in Appliqué, is also about the layering process but delves more deeply into drawing a pattern, color choices, and features an alternative machine method.

In her teaching, she encourages students to sift through her many techniques, using them to draw out their own visions and creativity. Her expressed hope is to help them express their own personal concepts and to realize that quiltmaking is a viable art form.

Tips and Tricks

Quilt marking alternatives:

Use freezer paper as a template on simple shapes: Cut out your shape on freezer paper, iron it in place, quilt around it, peel it off and reuse in another spot.

Tear-away method: Mark the pattern on tissue-like paper, pin to your quilt top, quilt through the paper and tear the paper away when done. November 2008 Page 3






