February Guild Presentation with Phyllis Binkley

Phyllis specializes in Western Mountain and Desert Landscape Quilted Wall Hangings. She uses her own hand-dyed fabrics for sky and mountains. All of her pieces are one of a kind, Original Art Designs.

She never repeats a quilt and none are made into kits. The workshops she teaches encourage original designs. Many of her pieces include hand as well as machine embroidery on the flowers in the foreground.

Machine thread painting is also used on trees and foliage. Beads, three-dimensional fabrics, trapunto, and many other enhancements add interest, textures, and sparkle to the landscapes.

Many of her wall hangings include horses, birds, and wild animals such as bear, deer, elk, moose, wolves, etc. Alaska is one of her favorite places. The expanse of the huge mountains and abundance of wildlife there has had a real influence on her work. Although she loves the mountain scenery, she also does

many desert scenes with blooming cactus and desert animals.

Phyllis is a retired Art teacher of 30 years. About 1994, her mother, who is a traditional quilter in Illinois, insisted that she attend the International Quilt Show in Houston. That was a life changing experience. She began to see that quilts could be expressive, personal statements and that quilters did not have to stick to preset patterns.

She has a Masters Degree in Art with background in weaving and fabric design, but teaching in these areas was limited in public schools.

Since her retirement in December 1999, her passion for fabrics, dying and creating with these materials has led her through some interesting and enjoyable experiences. The method of collage has always been one of her favorites. Using either flower print fabrics or landscape textures to create original designs and compositions, she has found that raw edge appliqué is versatile

Free motion machine stitching, thread painting, and hand embroidery allow her to enhance the collages with stitches and details. She has been giving Landscape Workshops since 2002 and enjoys teaching adults, especially ladies who share her love of fabrics and quilting.



Tips and Tricks - submitted by Mary Tabar

After seeing many quilts washed, I have seen a lot of binding problems. First problem I have seen is binding coming loose after washing. Use a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam to put a binding on a quilt that will be washed. If sewing by hand, stitch a small over hand stitch. Also using a bias binding will last much longer on a quilt that is washed.

This month, I'm featuring Wanzie Walley, a living treasure member, who has been quilting since 1980 when she

moved to Aberdeen, Scotland. At that time, she used leftover fabrics from making her granddaughter's dresses for a Sunbonnet Sue quilt. Although she mostly likes traditional quilts, she does admire the innovative ways quilting is



done today by younger quilters. Wanzie says that the rotary cutter and strip piecing are her favorite improvements to quilting. She feels these came about because the younger quilters are mostly educated, working women who don't have time to play around cutting one piece at a time. Now we all benefit from these time-saving techniques.

Wanzie usually watches TV or listens to music while she's quilting. If she gets stuck on a project she'll put it away for a few days and then take a look again later, with fresh eyes. Wanzie has been a member of a wonderful, small sewing group for about 10 years. Her advice to beginners is to get a solid foundation in quilting by taking a really good all-around beginner's class. One particularly helpful technique that Wanzie learned from a teacher and uses all the time is how to miter and turn the corner on her bindings.

Keep up the good work, Wanzie.






