For over 30 years, Peggy has been quilting and helping others catch the "quilting bug."

Teaching and sharing the art of quilt making is her passion. She has taught quilt making in Alaska, Washington, California, Idaho and Oregon, teaching large guild classes, quilting retreats, quilt

shops and small private groups in her home.

Because of her expertise and attention to detail, Peggy has made quilts that have won many awards and been accepted for showing at the Association of Pacific Northwest Quilter's show in Seattle. Her quilt, "Roses for Travis and Sharon" is pictured in the book, "Rose Sampler Supreme," by Rosemary Mahkan. She was recently published in Quilter's Newsletter and Fonz and Porter's Love of Quilting magazines. She has published many patterns.

Peggy loves all types of quilting but traditional quilts are her favorite. Her preferred stitching methods are machine piecing, hand quilting, needle-turn appliqué and crazy quilting. She is accredited to teach the Thimblelady method of hand quilting.

She enjoys the challenge of learning and experimenting with different techniques in the quilt making process, always looking for an easier way to conquer those seemingly difficult patterns.

- Challenge yourself by trying something new. Maybe a challenge is all you need for inspiration and to get moving again?

- Take your problem to your local quilt shop. There you'll find very knowledgeable ladies who work through their customer's problems every day. You'll probably also find a perfect fabric to use for sashing, borders or quilt backing, too, or at least some "new arrival" fabric or fat quarters to buy.

- Take a refresher class on that technique you need for the project. This means you don't have to commit yourself to an entire project using the technique, just learn and keep it in your personal "tool box" for a future project.

- Come to the guild meetings and special guild events. There is something about listening to guest speakers and just being around other quilters that can get you motivated again.

- When nothing seems to be working...temporarily turn to something else. That's right, just walk away and read a book, take a walk outside, or hunt for the chocolate you have stashed away.

I hope one of these possible solutions will work for you. We want you back into quilting very soon! See you in March at Garden Road Elementary School.

Tips and Tricks

If you prewash your fabrics by machine, you have probably suffered through the tangle of excess threads that sometimes pull away from the cut edges. Try this trick to help cut down on this problem - open the cut of fabric out flat and snip a small (1/2") triangle from each corner. Wash as usual, and prepare to be pleasantly surprised at the lack of tangled threads.

Most of you probably know Rebecca Lighthill as the lovely lady with the friendly smile and infectious laugh who presents the Opportunity of the Month at guild meetings. An

avid reader, Rebecca began quilting in the mid nineties after reading 'The Art & Craft of Quilting.' At the time, she had just achieved an associate's degree in architectural drafting at Palomar College. After reading the book on quilting, however, inspiring her to attend both the Visions Quilt Show and San Diego Quilt Show, she says she was so awestruck by the art



quilts she saw that she gave up the notion of looking for a job and took up quilting instead. "I had always wanted to become an artist," Rebecca recalls. "Quilting offered the potential to express myself artistically."


Enthusiastic to get started, Rebecca joined the Friendship Guild, attending every workshop available. She admits that since then, she's become more discriminating, focusing on the techniques she enjoys most, especially the creativity of design,

Rebecca recalls her first attempt at quilting, culmi-

nating in an 18" by 24" pink and blue scrappy quilt she still owns. "I purchased several fabrics in an eighth of a yard each, and just followed the picture in the book, which didn't come with much instruction." She laughs as the memory expands, "I did know to use a quarter inch seam allowance, but had no idea how to assemble, quilt the layers, or bind." She ended up hand quilting in the ditch with the old, tried and true, 'poke the needle through to the back and poke around till you find the right place to come back up' method. Works every time.

All those workshops have paid off, though, and Rebecca has honed her skills since that first project. In fact, after attending a workshop recently, she completed a quilt implementing the techniques she learned from quilter and author, Jan Krentz. Rebecca is proud to announce her quilt will be featured in the author's new book, which should be on the shelves in February. Isn't that exciting?

Next time you're at the guild meeting, take a moment to drop by the Opportunity of the Month table and say hello to Rebecca. One of the things she says she loves most about her board position is the opportunity offered her to meet other quilters. Take the opportunity to donate a useful item, a dollar to win a prize, or just receive a winning smile from Rebecca. You can't lose!
