

Getting to Know You (submitted by Susan Axelrod)

Featured quilter, Pat Wolfe, had been sewing since she was a teenager, making clothes and home decor items, but didn't really get interested in quilting until she attended a

Quilt Visions show in 1990. There she saw the exciting things being done with fabrics and quilting. She signed up for Peggy Martin's class in 1991 and has kept on learning and quilting ever since. Quilting has really changed over the years. Pat says, "The range of fabric designs and colors is fantastic now. The use of all sorts of



embellishments, fusing materials, paint sticks, and inks inspire us to create "artsy" quilts." Pat loves colorful quilts, artsy quilts, and traditional quilts with contemporary fabrics and designs that play with geometric shapes. When asked about her advice to beginning quilters, she urges them to take all the workshops and classes they possibly can. Don't be afraid to try new and different techniques or fabrics and don't be afraid to use lots of color. A technique Pat learned, from Wendy Mathson, was how to join the two ends of binding. It's a fast and easy method that fits perfectly every time. Pat enjoys quilting by machine while listening to music or TV in the background. The small sewing group she belongs to started with 3 ladies getting together to quilt once a week back in the mid-1990's. This grew to a nine-member group today. When Pat is stuck on a project she'll take her problem to her small group as they are never shy about giving opinions or suggestions.

Keep up the good work, Pat. We love your creations!
