WOW! “The Challenge of the Century” was a tremendous success thanks to eight wonderful ladies. Their quilts were all works of art, making it very hard to decide “Viewer Choice.” Susan Rolfsen tallied the votes and the Chicken/Rooster Quilt made by Janice Rudgers won. Note: Four quilts are going to Rady’s Children Hospital, including the Chicken/Rooster Quilt (this quilt will be displayed at the 4th of July Quilt Show first before heading to Rady’s Children Hospital); four quilts are destined for Veteran’s Hospital.

Summary of Giving Season of 2008-2009...Last year, June 2008 thru May 2009, the following items were donated to Philanthropy from the guild members: 52 quilts, 165-196 placemats, 17 quilt tops, 14 doo-rags, 1 chemo-scarf, 11 wheel chair bags, 150 Christmas stockings. These items were donated to Veteran's Hospital, Life Choices Center, Penasquitos Lutheran Church (for their charity work - our guild used their facility for workshops), So, Rady's Children's Hospital, Meals on Wheels, St Claire's Home, Miramar Library, Quilts of Valor (for returning wounded veterans), and Palomar Hospital. (Note: Eight to ten quilt tops, backs, and batting are waiting to be completed.) The best news of all ... **at least 84 guild members participated**.. “Thank You” for emphasizing the “Friend” in “Friendship Guild”.



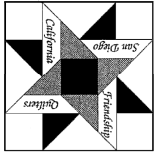

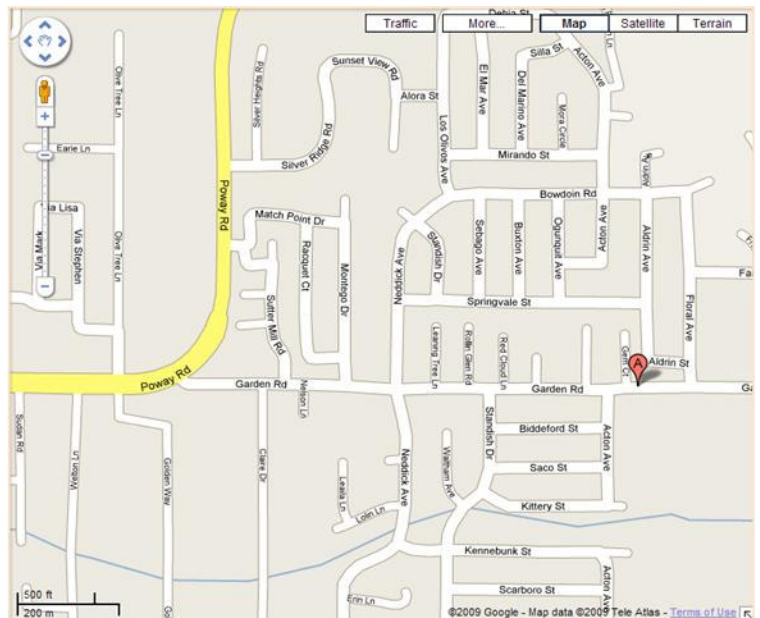
