

Getting to Know You (submitted Linda Card)

Our roving FQSD Guild reporter caught up with **Hope Campbell**, Philanthropy Co-Chair and posed some questions for her. Here is what we found out. **Can you tell us a little about your family.** My husband and I are empty nesters. The children are grown and gone. No grandkids yet. But we still live in this big house. Which is great, because one bedroom is my sewing room, shared with nothing else.

Where do you call home? Home – that's an interesting thought. I think of home as west coast, since most of my relatives live in the Central Valley, and I think of Frankfurt, Germany as home because we lived there for 10 years while teaching in DoDDS. I've lived in Rancho Bernardo for 22 years, so this is home, too.

How long have you been quilting? I took my first quilting class from Poway Quilt Shop in 1989. I started out taking a basic quilting class, then a colors class from Arlene Stamper, followed by a Bargello quilt class and an attic windows class. I was hooked.

When did you first join Friendship Quilters of San Diego (first time)? I joined FQSD just two years ago. I can't imagine that I haven't been involved longer. But, kids, graduate school, and other life events too priority.

Do you still do much piecing, or are you all about the quilting? I like to piece quilts that use strip methods of one way or another either for cutting or sewing. It takes me too long to hand quilt, so I usually tie the quilts, most of which I give away. Lately I've gone to quilting by check book.

What is the most challenging part of quilting for you? There are two challenges: deciding on all the fabrics that will go into the quilt, and then when it's finished, deciding on the quilting pattern – if I'm going to do it. I've done some machine quilting myself, but with my regular machine and a 9" throat, it's a challenge.

What are your favorite quilting tools? I really like the pivoting cutting mat I just purchased. But the tool I can't be without is my Ruby Beholder that I use to find the color value of fabric.

What is your current favorite quilting book or pattern? I've made several

Cathedral Windows quilts recently. I love the Storm at Sea pattern and want to make one, but I'm frozen in indecision about the colors to use. I guess I can always make several.

What is your favorite flavor of ice cream? I like double vanilla – on peach pie.

Do you prefer salty or sweet snacks? Salty before a meal, and sweet after a mean. But I don't like to keep snacks in the house because then I'll eat them.



What is your favorite beverage? I drink way too much coffee. They say a pot of coffee a day isn't good for you. I'm trying to wean myself to herbal tea instead. What is your least favorite food? My least favorite food is the kind that is hard to get off the pot or pan it was cooked in. And, anything with soy sauce or curry in it.

What is your favorite season of the year? In San Diego I can't tell what season it is unless I look at the calendar. Oh, and whether the doors are closed or open. If the front and back doors are closed it must be because the heat or air conditioning is on. One thing I miss in San Diego is the long summer evenings. All of us who have lived in a northern location know about the wonderful long summer evenings when the sun doesn't go down until 10:00 PM. I miss that in San Diego.

What are your favorite books/authors? I like reading non-fiction. I like looking at and reading cookbooks and quilting books as my bedtime reading. What are your favorite movies? I like romantic comedies, fictionalized history (*Blind Side, Julie and Julia*), and anything Pixar. *Up* was fantastic.

What is one of your goals for 2010? The goal in 2010 is to submit my newsletter articles before I get the reminder that the newsletter deadline has arrived! Is there anything else you'd like to tell us about quilting? Joining quilting guilds has been one of the best things I've done in recent years.




