# Philanthropy

I am sharing with you today my favorite go-to pattern when I need something done quickly. The secret to making this go quickly is chain stitching the squares as you assemble the rows. It makes it so easy to remember in which direction to set the striped square. I can usually get this quilt top done easily in a day. Soooooo, .....maybe YOU can make one for one of our good causes!!

**Warm Wishes quilt requirements** One focus fabric of a bold print, 1 1/8 yard, depending on whether or not you will be "fussy cutting." Cut into 32 6 1/2 inch squares.

Three coordinating colors, preferably dark, medium, light, or of contrasting hues. You will need 3/8 yard of each. Cut 5 width of fabric strips 2 1/2 inches wide.

Whatever you wish for a border. I always count 5 widths of fabric, but vary whether that means a 3 inch, (15 inches) 4 inch (20 inches), or 5 inch (25 inches) border.

Note: Online pattern called for 1 1/4 yard focus fabric and 1/4 yard each of fabric for strips. It does allow a little "cushion.")



This quilt consists of 2 blocks: one unsewn focus fabric, and one cut into squares from sewn strip sets made up of a 3 narrow strips. The pattern comes from the way you turn the stripes next to each block.

Sew the 3 strips together along the length with scant 1/4 " seam. Do this for all strips and press so they are straight (not arced). Cut these into 6 !/2 " squares to match the same size of your unsewn focus fabric.

Sew the rows together following the photo, orienting the dark and mediums as indicated. NOTE THAT IN ONE ROW STRIP SET SQUARES ARE SEWN VERTICALLY. IN THE NEXT ROW THEY ARE SEWN HORIZONTALLY. NOTE ALSO, THAT THE STRIP SET SQUARES ALTERNATE WHICH COLOR IS ON RIGHT/LEFT OR TOP/BOTTOM. ADD THE BORDER.

# Big News about: Our Loot Locker


Thank you to everyone who contributed to the October loot locker. It was another great success!! We were able to collect \$89.44!!
