We have not been able to work on the quilt which was supposed to be for this year since we have gone into shutdown. Colleen, Robyn, Candy and Charleen will continue to work on that quilt when we can to be ready for the 2021-2022 quild year.

The quilts are in sizes that are conveniently done on a domestic machine. They do not require free motion quilting. Stitch-in-the-ditch or straight stitching is fine. They also do not require binding by hand.

## October Retreat Information



Happy June everyone. In an effort to keep everyone up to date on the October retreat, I want to let you know that I have spoken with the Director a couple of weeks ago. Vina de Lestonnac is still closed, but hopes to reopen soon. They are not sure what the new retreat experience will look like and they are exploring many options regarding their reopening. Some of the issues Vina is addressing are: room size and the amount of people we can have in each bedroom; social distancing requirements and how many people we can have in the conference center at a time; and, of course, food service. Wearing a mask may be something that has to be enforced due to our close proximity and relative age of our group.

Meanwhile, Vina is using this time to spruce up the rooms, there is a lot of repainting going on, and they are busy working on their new menu and how they may have to serve food. One of the things being explored is serving "boxed" meals to each conference center instead of walking up to the main building for our meals as they can no longer have the buffet line and salad bar.

I know that all of these changes may not be what you are looking forward to when it comes to our retreat. As such, if for any reason you want to pull out of the October retreat, please let me know. There will be no penalty for doing so and we will refund 100% of your money as soon as possible, just please allow us time to get the check cut, signed and mailed. With social distancing, it is a bit more complicated as we are not gathering together like we used to.

Again, we will have more concrete information in September after they have had a chance to reopen and shake things loose. I am sure that everyone has many questions, unfortunately I don't believe Vina is in a position to answer them just yet.

As they go through the reopening process, Vina de Lestonnac will continue to make modifications to their schedule and the way they address dealing with the variety of groups that use their facilities.
