

FYI the guild has an unbelievable resource available to all our members. It is a GO BIG! Accuquilt cutter with dies and mats that can be checked out like a library book. All you need is a \$50.00 deposit (which is returned to you when the cutter and dies are returned in good condition). This means it's FREE!

If you have wondered how it works or have been wanting an Accuquilt system, now is the time to find out what all the hoopla is about. Super easy to use. You will love the accuracy and time savings in cutting out a project.

Now is the time to get rid of that unruly stash! And the GO BIG! can help you do just that. Here's a list of the dies that we have so far.

2 1/2 " strip cutter 10" Square Bill Kerr's local color

7" Drunkard's Path 4",6",7" & 8" Circles

1 1/2", 1 3/4", 2 1/4" & 2 1/2" Circles

## October 12, 2020 Meeting:

Professional quilter **Trudy Cleveland** will present her **lecture** "**Upgrade Your Toolbox.**" Whether we're preparing for a show submission, or just sharing our work with the guild and friends, good photography is HUGE. Her presentation explains how to use your smartphone as a tool to enhance your quilting process and capture your finished efforts. She'll cover how to edit images for printing or posting on social media and how two organize our photos. Let's all learn to take pictures which show off our colors and workmanship and get closer to the "wow factor" we've created!

The following Wednesday and Friday mornings Trudy offers us her **workshop:** "How to Photograph Quilts" in two 3-hour sessions.

FIRST SESSION: Instruction on taking photographs with a smartphone including: The whole quilt view, close-up view, portrait view, back of quilt and the label.

SECOND SESSION: We'll edit images taken at the first session. Using features on smartphones we will: crop and adjust contrast, exposure, brightness, brilliance and saturation of color to make the image and quilting "pop".
