
President's Message




St. Patrick's Day Cocktails

It's that time again! Time to have elections for officers for our 2021-2022 guild year. We would like to get nominations between now and April 5th, and do elections at the April meeting. All of these positions do not have to be a single person. Several persons can co-chair a position to share the work.

Here is a quick list of board positions. If you would like the full more detailed description, please email Candy and she can email it to you.

Positions:

President: Presides over all meetings and prepares an agenda for the board meeting. Cosigner on guild checks with the Treasurer. Provides an article for the monthly guild newsletter. Keeps in contact with all officers and committee members.

President-Elect: Serves as a back-up for the President and presides over any meetings if the President is not available. It is basically an understudy for the President position.

Treasurer: Keeps accurate records of receipts and expenditures authorized by the Board. Cosigns checks with another officer and reports the account balances to the Board at the Board meetings.

Secretary: Keeps an accurate record of all regular business and board meetings and submits a summary of the meetings by the next Board meeting. The Secretary can also sign Board checks.

1st **VP Program Chair**: Co-chairs programs and workshops, making contracts with monthly guild speakers for the current year.

2nd **VP Program Chair**: Co-chairs programs and workshops developing programs and workshops for the succeeding year.

Membership Chair: Maintains the membership of the guild by collecting dues, membership forms and handing out membership cards to new members.

Philanthropy Chair: Coordinates charity donations to San Diego Organizations. Prepares and distributes placemat and quilt kits for members to sew. Maintains fabric donations, distributes finished items to participating agencies, organizes Philanthropy events.

Opportunity of the Month: Raises funds for the guild by doing a raffle or silent auction.

Opportunity Quilt: Organizes a committee to make an Opportunity Quilt to raise funds for the guild for the year, acting as marketing chairman and keeper of the quilt between fundraising opportunities. She/he is not responsible for doing all the fundraising for the quilt, but will coordinate with members of the guild to take the quilt to fundraising events

Retreat Chair: Organizes the guild quilt retreats. Our usual time frame is May and October. The contracts are set up one year in advance.

Opportunity of the Month: Raises funds for the guild by doing a raffle or silent auction at monthly meetings.

Library Chairs: Maintain and update Friendship Guild's library of quilt books, make purchases of new books, maintain inventory and check out/in records.

Website: The webmaster maintains the guild's website and updates the website with the monthly newsletter, sharing photos from the guild meeting and upcoming programs and workshops.

Newsletter: Gathers and correlates articles, creates the monthly guild newsletter to keep members informed of current and upcoming events for the guild.

Refreshments: Sets up the refreshment table with paper supplies, makes coffee, provides other drinks if allowed at the meeting place, cleans table and food areas at the end of the meetings, not responsible for bringing the food for the table.

Monthly Fun: Coordinates activities for members to do a challenge or UFO or other events as determined by the chairperson. This event may collect fees to purchase prizes for those who participate in the event.

Loot Locker: Collects money and gives it to the treasurer for items members may purchase from the donation table.

Sharing: Provides and collects the sharing slips and may photograph, or provide a photographer, to take pictures of items shared by members at the the guild meetings, organize and enter data on the guild software, send the information electronically to the webmaster to put on the website.

At the present time, we don't know all the positions that will be available, although President, VP1 Programs, and VP2 Programs are definitely available. There is an abundance of help for new officers and you can always do it with a partner.
