We also have a section regarding Living Treasurers. Check out the wording below and be prepared to vote on this at the April meeting. As our guild is aging, more people are qualifying for this title, but the guild can't afford the additional insurance costs to keep supporting this benefit.

At the present time the by-laws state:

Article III Membership and Dues

Section 3: Living Treasures. Members of the guild who have attained the age of 75 and have been members for at least one full year are valued members of the guild. Their membership fee is waived, and these members are entitled to all rights and privileges of any other active member.

Proposed Change to Membership and Dues:

Remove Article III. Section 3

Based on the discussion at the March meeting, many people want to remove this section so that everyone except our one Lifetime Member would pay full dues.

If you have been a member of the guild for at least one year and have a current financial hardship that would make it difficult to pay the dues, please talk to the Membership Chair about having the guild pay part of the dues so you can continue enjoying your connection to friends and fellow guilters.

With vaccines becoming more available, we hope that we may be meeting in person in September of 2021 for our next guild year.


Philanthropy News from Ruth
