We are very happy to announce the October 2021 Retreat at Vina de Lestonnac is a GO! The retreat dates are Friday, October 15 - Sunday, October 17. The retreat is full and I will be contacting you individually regarding any balance due and retreat specifics.

Vina de Lestonnac opened their doors to the public in June and has been successfully hosting retreats for the past two months. Many COVID-19 protocols have been put in place. I am sure you have many questions, so I will attempt to address significant changes below:

- The retreat center is requiring each of us to sign a release form, releasing Vina from any liability should you become ill after your visit.
- The Guild is also requiring we each sign a release form, releasing the Guild from any liability should you become ill after your visit.
- A Health Care form for emergency purposes must be completed by all attendees.
- All participants are required to be vaccinated in addition to any quests that come to visit.
- All participants must show a copy of your COVID-19 Vaccination Record to the Retreat Coordinator or other officer of the Guild.
- There are no longer triple rooms available, only single and double rooms, so this may impact your roommate situation.
- All meals are being served in the dining hall, but the meals and salads are plated by Vina's staff.
- We will still have our treat table, but all food brought in must be packaged in individually sealed packages, such as single serving bags of chips or individually wrapped candies. No veggie trays, salsa, large bags of chips, etc.
- Because everyone is required to be vaccinated, masks will not be required in the conference room.

Most importantly, participation in the retreat is voluntary. The Guild cannot guarantee a COVID free environment, but we are making a concentrated effort to put precautions in place to limit our exposure.

Attendance at the retreat is strictly voluntary and the Guild assumes no liability should anyone become ill after attending the retreat.

We know our members have all traversed this pandemic differently, many of us having various health issues making us more vulnerable to COVID, or have family members we are trying to protect. This retreat is somewhat different than those in the past, but all actions being taken are done with everyone's well-being in mind. PROGRAMS

Our September Speaker is Rhonda Pierce of Schmetz Needles. Her talk is entitled "What Needle Should I Use?" She will be talking about the most important 2" piece of steel in the sewing machine. Rhonda's classes are filled with "A Ha" moments and giggles as you learn about needle facts. She is the Spokesperson for Schmetz Needles North America and Vice President of Euro-Notions. She publishes the e-zine "Schmetz Inspired to Sew", she is a certified FitNice System Instructor, and

earned the Brendon Burchard High Performance Certificate. Her last quilt "Color Splash" was displayed at three international quilt festivals. There will be no workshop for September.



WORKSHOPS

We have a new requirement for signing up for workshops. Because of the teacher contracts we need to know we have enough people taking the workshop in order to break even. If we do not have enough attendees we have to cancel the workshop 30 days in advance of the workshop.

In the October Guild Meeting we will have Sarah Goer of Sarah Goer Quilts coming to do a lecture/demo entitled "Creating A Scrappy Slab". Get your scraps out of your scrap bin and into a project. Sarah will demonstrate her technique for building a "scrappy slab" from scrap fabrics of any size. She will show us numerous ways to use these in projects and quilts.

Sarah's Workshop is titled "Improv Log Cabins". This is your opportunity to try a new spin on the traditional log cabin block. You can choose small or large-scale. Play with size of strips, background, placement, symmetry, and other elements to create your own unique improv log cabin. The Improv Log Cabin Workshop will be on Saturday Oct. 23rd & 30th from 9am to noon on Zoom. The workshop costs \$45 for members and \$55 for non-members.
