



WHAT IS SCCQG?

Some of you might be asking what is SCCQG? You probably have heard about it in the past at our guild meetings or have seen it mentioned in our newsletter. SCCQG is the acronym for SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA COUNCIL OF QUILT GUILDS and the reason I'm writing this article is because I did not know what this organization was about nor it's purpose. Let's find out together.

SCCQC.org is their website and below is what is posted as their purpose.

"The purpose of the site is to provide council information to member guilds, business partners, and individual members."

The Council provides an information network for guilds- a place to share resources, to encourage friendships locally and worldwide, to foster education through sharing of speakers and programs, a resource for those who want to start a new guild, and to share a calendar of events for the Southern CA area of quilting events.

Laura Martin is our representative for SCCQG and attends the three meetings each year either by zoom or in person. She feels it is a very helpful organization and benefits our



members and guild by providing all that was mentioned above as well as providing the source where Friendship purchases our I million dollar liability insurance at the low cost of \$3.25 per member. The school district and City require us to have a 3 million dollar policy and the guild has to go outside SCCQG to purchase this protection and it is very expensive.

One of the three meetings each year in April is titled "Meet the Teachers" where quilting instructors give a short presentation of their expertise and members are able to visit their booths (or see on Zoom) and get ideas of who might be a good fit to be a speaker and give a program for their guild.

Surprisingly there are approximately IO2 guilds who are members and it is not just guilds in Southern CA but also a couple from Las Vegas, Fort Bragg (north of Humboldt), central CA, San Luis Obispo and everywhere in-between.

It is extremely beneficial to have a group of people to share suggestions of how to run a guild, improve your guild, encourage members to volunteer, increase membership, and create successful fundraisers- all to make a bigger and better guild!

Now we all know about SCCQG!
