Guild Mask Use Policy

We all want Covid to be gone and over! However, as we all know it isn't. The board has mulled over what we should do. As we all know, we have many older people and people who have health issues in the guild. And we want to protect everyone. The board voted on the below policy.

There are four levels of community transmission defined by the CDC. These tiers are based upon the percentage of positive tests per 100,000 people in the county. Remember that they can only count the tests turned into labs. This does not include home tests or asymptomatic cases. So the case rate is actually much higher than reported. The case rate is updated every Thursday at sandiegocounty.gov.

The tiers are:
RED - HIGH TRANSMISSION
ORANGE - SUBSTANTIAL
TRANSMISSION
YELLOW - MODERATE
TRANSMISSION
BLUE - LOW TRANSMISSION

We will require masks at all guild functions when we are in the RED or ORANGE tier. We are currently in the RED tier. The good news is that San Diego County has been on a downward direction. So let's all hope that it continues. We appreciate everyone's cooperation and understanding with our policy.



LECTURE: BATIKS, THE HISTORY, THE MYSTERY Hi! I am Susie Shkolnik, a real "born and raised" California girl. I started sewing at age II, making doll clothes, then... my own clothes in high school and going on to work in the garment industry. In 1996, while living in Malaysia, I became fascinated with the batik process... falling in love with the colors in batiks, and the feeling they created. A whole new world had opened up. Several years after returning from Malaysia I opened my own quilt shop and was able to offer a large variety of batiks to other quilters and teach classes on color and design using batik panels, many other techniques incorporating batiks. I love designing guilts and patterns using batiks as they are so rich in color and so wonderful to work with. As a designer of batiks for BatiksTextiles since 2010, I am passionate about the history and culture that batiks represent in today's textile industry. Traveling to Bali and Java every spring and summer, I have worked with the craftsmen in creating the beautiful batiks for us to use here in the United States and around the world. I am blessed to be apart of this company and the community of designers that bring our batiks to life through their designs.



Use batik strip sets to create beautiful 16" blocks made with 4 triangles using coordinating colors and tones. Use 5-6 different color groups to create a rich look. Piano key border is made from strip set scraps. This workshop will include study and discussion of color and design. A limited amount of random strips of batik will be available free of charge for exchanging or filling in. Packages of 8-1/4 yard cuts in blues, greens, purples, golds, and browns will be available for purchase or you may use your stash or scraps. Supply list provided at class sign up. Hi, I am Susan Busch, your new motivator for just getting those unfinished quilts done this year. The program this year will have two parts; first month taking inventory, the following months working on your projects that your heart says to "just get it done".

Attached is the inventory sheet (page 21) that you could use to list all of those projects lurking in corners, closets and under beds. You can also use one that Hope Campbell will submit to the website for download (page 22), or if you have one you



like better use that one. At the October meeting you will come to my table and submit your list. You will be given a ticket for the drawing. We will have a prize for someone in October for just doing their inventory. Then you will fill out your "Just Get It Done" form with your 5 projects listed and the month you plan to have it done. Done means completely done with binding and dated label. You can submit a photo to me via my cell phone. I would hope you bring it in for sharing though. Be LOUD AND PROUD! 
