SOMETHING I HIGHLY RECOMMEND-YOU WON'T REGRET IT

I have had an app on my iPhone and iPad for many years and use it for every quilt I make- seriously. Do you have the Robert Kaufman Quilting Calculator on your devices? It is free and oh, so helpful because it does all the work and math for you when you need to know how many yards and cut strips are

needed for backing, batting, binding, borders and much more. All you need to do is put in the length and width of your quilt top and how wide you want your binding or borders. No more math, calculators and headaches- it is so quick and easy.

What is so exciting is I discovered at the last Philanthropy meeting is Sue Mezera and her husband, Mark, designed the software for the program for the Robert Kaufman Quilting Calculator!!! Can you believe this? Wow! We have so many talented people in our quild.



Go to the App Store, type in "Robert Kaufman Quilting Calculator", and then click "OPEN" or "GET". It will look like this (see photo). Then use it! If you need help downloading or questions on how to use it just ask me and I'll help you out.


