As part of a Mother/Daughter duo, Patricia Belyea and Victoria Stone are the co-owners of Okan Arts, a Seattle based company. Mesmerized by the beauty of Japanese textiles, they are makers of creative quilts, teachers, and speakers. Their West Coast business imports vintage textiles from Japan, runs quilting workshops, leads tours to Japan, and offers quilts made by Patricia in its online gallery.

Patricia's presentation will take us to Japan for a flashback of the Tokyo Quilt Festival, on a tour of the 2022 Yokohama Quilt Show, and then a visit to a traditional chusen-dyeing workshop.

Patricia's presentation will include a show of her own quilts, all made with vintage Japanese cottons, and she will speak with us about how these special fabrics have inspired her.

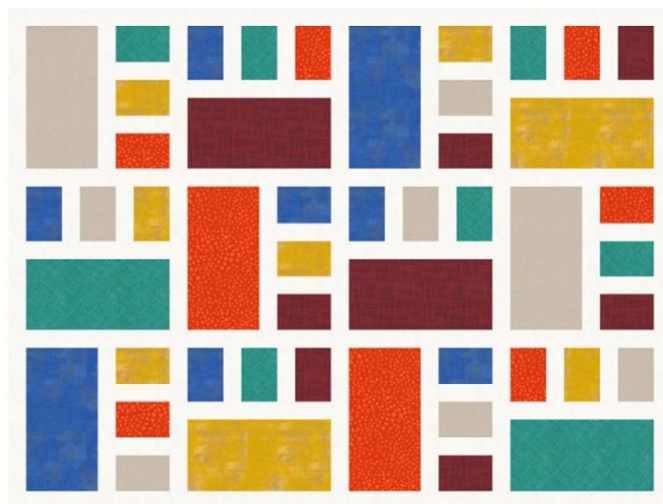
To aid this effort, we are providing Sit and Sews on the First Friday of the Month and Third Saturday of the Month from 10:00 to 3:00 at:
