# **President's Message**

Greetings friends!

This year is rushing by! Here we are firmly facing the holiday season already! As I write this, my turkey is defrosting in the refrigerator upstairs! (Admittedly, it is early. This might be the first year I don't have to finish defrosting it under running water on Thanksgiving morning!)

I was so intrigued by the California History Quilt Project presentation. I am thankful there are those committed to collecting the history that makes up the quilting world... and that includes all of us. We ARE the quilting world. Or at least a little corner of it. Thanks to those who came on Tuesday morning and afternoon to have your quilts photographed, have their data collected, and consequently be entered into the quilt index. It was fun to see some OLD beautiful quilts, and some newer beautiful quilts too! A couple things became clear... first, we don't know everything we wish we knew about the quilts of the previous generations that are in our families. So many details of why each quilt was made, where the fabric came from and who all helped make it are lost when our elders went to their graves. This is a great reason to document the quilts we are making. Get the stories of your quilts written down... whether it is in a notebook or on the Quilt Index (but I recommend the Index, since future generations can look that up from wherever they are!) ... so the future generations can continue to tell the stories of your quilts. Secondly, many of us don't have family that wants our old family quilts or to keep our quilts in the family. What do we do with the old quilts we own, and the new ones we are making, when we get to the end of our lives? There are some museums, but most of us don't own or make 'museum' quilts. There are quilt auction houses, but shipping our quilts to them is expensive and there is no guarantee they will sell. They can be donated to charity for re-sale or to keep someone warm who needs it. Organizations like California Heritage Quilt Project can accept some that they use for fundraisers, and two of our members took them up on that offer, but they can't take all of them that are out there. They suggest use them. Enjoy them. Use them every day and wear them out.

And while I could tell you a LOT more about the Quilt Index and the California Heritage Quilt Project, it is time to shift gears and talk about our HOLIDAY PARTY! Join in for a festive time together, a good meal, and some fun on Tuesday, December

10 at the Hamburger Factory in Poway. Bring a wrapped decoration (it doesn't have to be a tree ornament) to share in our decoration exchange, and we'll have some other fun stuff to do... but mostly, we'll enjoy being together. THERE IS STILL TIME TO SIGN UP. I have to turn in the final numbers one week ahead. on December 3, so text or call me to RSVP (858)883-8038. The cost is \$25 payable to the guild... by Zelle, sending a check to the guild, or paying by cash or check made out to the guild the night of the party.

Finally, I was gratified to hear all the chatter when I asked you to share your worst quilting mistake at the beginning of the November guild meeting. None of us is perfect. We have all made embarrassing mistakes. And we have all lived through them. Part of being friends is sharing our downs as well as our ups... so don't let your mistakes keep you up at night. And keep on quilting!

# **Quilter of the Month Spotlight: Cheryl Neuharth**























This December, we are excited to feature Cheryl Neuharth. Cheryl has been a member of Friendship Quilt Guild for many years and if you don't already know her, you surely have been greeted by her and seen her smiling face at the Membership table! Thank you Cheryl for the time you spend assisting all of us at Friendship!

Long before Cheryl was born, both of her grandfathers worked for the Santa Fe Railroad as track supervisors and both families also lived in railroad coaches that had been converted into living spaces. Cheryl's paternal grandmother convinced the Santa Fe Railroad to attach a flatbed to her coach so she could grow a garden. Her grandfather then built flower and vegetable boxes for her to plant her garden in. Pictures of her grandmother's garden were published in the Santa Fe Newsletter.

Cheryl's mom attended high-school in Capistrano while her parents were on the tracks by living with her aunt who was a professional seamstress. Her mom graduated from high school in 1949. Also in 1949, her dad returned home from the Navy. That is when they were introduced and soon married in 1950. Cheryl arrived in 1952.

Cheryl's mom learned to sew while living with her aunt. When Cheryl was very young, her mom purchased a 1058 Singer sewing 403a machine. Cheryl said that mom would sew matching dresses for herself, Cheryl and her sister.

Cheryl was six years old when her mom taught her how to sew. Cheryl began with tube dresses for her Barbie, which she still has today. In middle school Cheryl took home economics, which led to her sewing her own clothes. She made a prom dress in 1970 and wedding dress 1976. In 1998 Cheryl made her first quilt for her first-born son, then for graduation including photos.

Cheryl's stepfather traveled all over the world and she yearned to travel when hearing his stories. After reading The Thorn Birds, her first trip was to Australia with her son and the Poway High School Band. Egypt was a place her dad dreamed of traveling to since being a small child. So, in 2000, she took her dad to Egypt. The local theater was decorated with Egyptian designs as it was built during the Egyptian era of discovery. They then traveled to Isreal together. Since that time Cheryl has traveled to Ireland, Scotland, Thailand, and Germany.

Cheryl became a LVN in 1974 and worked in various medical facilities. In 2014 she retired from the Poway School District after 20 years. Her favorite job was working in the Special Ed with medically fragile students. In 2016 Cheryl was diagnosed with Breast Cancer. She currently volunteers at Kaiser and speaks with women newly diagnosed with breast cancer, where she answers their questions and offers helpful tips with the process.

After her retirement, Cheryl's husband Ken (also her prom date) bought an Airstream Trailer and they traveled for months at a time throughout the Western states. Cheryl also collects vintage Singer Machines and everything with the red S label. She still owns her mom's machine.

Cheryl enjoys making quilts for philanthropy, charities, Breast Cancer Awareness, and memory quilts. Most recently she donated her inherited family quilts to the California Heritage Quilt Project, as they will document the history and preserve them.
